About Friday evening presentation

In St. Andrew's Nave, 7:00-8:30pm

Astrobiology is the study of life as it happens to planets. As we continue to discover more and more planets (3500+) and more and more diversity in Earth life (e.g., radiation and vacuum resistant bacteria), should we start to think differently about the definition and meaning of "life"? In an evening presentation, Dr. Mix will talk about the diverse and changing ways we think about life and why it matters to Christians.

The author of *Life in Space: Astrobiology for Everyone* as well as a book of poems dealing with love and communication called *Species of Love*, Dr. Mix is at present working on a new book about the topic he is presenting at St. Andrew's. He will have some of his books on hand for purchase and signing.

In the Lenten series that follows, Dr. Mix will lead participants in looking at the "life of the world," the life of organisms, interior life, mental life, and life eternal. The Rev. Dr. Lucas John Mix studies life-concepts in biology and theology. After receiving a PhD in biology (2004 Harvard), he attended seminary in Berkeley, CA, and was ordained a priest in the Episcopal Church. He has served

as an inner-city pastor, college chaplain, and professor. He consults for NASA on interdisciplinary communication in the search for life in the universe and wrote a popular book - *Life in Space: Astrobiology for Everyone*. A member of the Society of Ordained Scientists, he writes and speaks regularly on theology and science.
