

If you've been drawn to icons but thought icon painting or "writing" was inaccessible, think again. Master icon teacher Peter Pearson gives instructions that enable you to get started and complete an icon. Participants have successfully completed a number of different icons in past workshops.


At the request of past participants, we are offering a second Epiphany workshop. Peter has selected the "Mother of God" icon featured on the front of this brochure as the Icon for this workshop.

Each workshop participant will receive easy-to-follow, step-by-step instructions, and all materials necessary to complete an icon. Texts and additional materials to further the pursuit of iconography will be available for purchase. Every session begins and ends with prayer and includes plenty of time for hands-on icon writing.

All participants are invited to a blessing of the icons created during our time together. The blessing will take place Sunday, February 3, at the 10:00 a.m. service at St. Andrew's. Please plan to stay on hand afterwards for Coffee Hour in the Parish Hall to exhibit your icon and share your experience with those curious about icons.

About Peter Pearson



A teacher of iconography for 25 years, Peter Pearson has studied with a number of masters. He has created countless icons for churches, institutions, and private collectors around the world. He has worked with art leagues, senior citizens, seminarians, school children, and college students. A frequent visitor to the NW, Peter has participated in Mount Angel Abbey's Iconography Institute in Oregon and has taught 7 workshops at The Center at St. Andrew's.

Peter studied architectural drafting, liturgical vesture, and art in worship. His design of worship space, furnishings, and vestments combines sound liturgical practice with artistic quality. He holds a Masters of Divinity from Saint Vincent Seminary in Latrobe, PA, as well as a Doctorate of Sacred Theology. A priest of the Episcopal Diocese of Bethlehem, PA, he served as pastor of parishes in New Hope and Scranton. In May 2017 Peter joined Holy Cross Monastery in West Park, New York.
